#### 1. Course assessment

## (40%) In-class exams

We have 3 in-class exams and I will take the best 2 out of 3, each will constitute 20% of the total assessment.

There is no make-up exam, regardless of reason.

#### (5%) Class attendance

For attendance, you are allowed to miss 2 classes. Every subsequent (the third, forth, etc.) class that you miss will cost 1% of the attendance unless with a valid reason such as medical reason, jury duty, etc. Attendance is taken at approximately 30 minutes after class start.

### (15%) Homework

The department has not informed me about how we are handling homework for this semester. I will inform you later.

From my past experience of "opening up homework at the end of the semester" by student requests, a lot of students took advantage of it to cramp all homework at the end of the semester, which is a bad practice from educational perspective. So for this semester: *There is no extension of deadline for homework, whatsoever. So don't ask for it.* 

#### (40%) Final Exam

The common final exam is given by the Department of Mathematics.
